Our Blessings

Dear Friends of St. Patrick's,

The last time I wrote to you, I addressed the first of our technology updates which included the upgrade of our telephone system. We rolled right into an essential update of our nursing call light system. I am happy to report that the new call light system has been installed and operating efficiently. Training sessions have taken place on the new system for staff on each unit and shift. We are pleased with the immediate, positive impact this upgrade is having on our responsiveness and overall resident experience.



As preparations begin for our 13th Annual Gold Key Gala, we have identified a need to replace our ergonomic lifts which ease the transfer process for our residents from bed to wheelchair and help to prevent staff injury. The new lifts will enhance resident comfort and quality of care. In preparation, we have scheduled product trials for staff to preview and evaluate the equipment. Based on defined requirements, staff and residents will provide feedback on each of the manufacturer's products in the trial.

I would like to report our progress on two key projects funded by our Gold Key Gala Events. The first project is the transition and modernization of our first floor rooms for sub-acute, short-term rehabilitation residents. (see page 3) On May 5th, we held an open house for hospital discharge planners and community representatives to tour the new sub-acute unit. I invite you to contact our Admissions Department to schedule a time to see the improvements.

The second project includes the proceeds from the 2015 Gold Key Gala which are designated for a renovation of the shower rooms on each unit. Administration and the architects are working to determine the scope of the project. In the meantime, the shower rooms have received a facelift to create a relaxing experience for the residents.

In the coming months, we will be working on a strategic assessment and plan to explore options for continued enhancements of our facility including the 2nd and 3rd floors. We will inform you of our progress through this newsletter and at our family forums.

Short -Term Rehab: The Suite Life

“Transitioning to Meet the Needs of the Times”

With the influx of nursing homes, supportive and assisted living and memory care facilities being built in DuPage County, people have many care choices. We encourage prospective residents to compare our facility with others in the community.

It was the Carmelite Foundress, Venerable Mother Angeline Teresa, who told her loyal Sisters they must “meet the needs of the times.” Today, to compete in an industry that has grown in so many aspects, St. Patrick’s has been working to keep up with these changing times. Our first floor has transitioned to a new sub-acute, short-term rehabilitation unit. Twelve rooms have been converted from double rooms to private suites to accommodate the privacy needs of our short-term rehabilitation patients. Each of these rooms consists of a sleeping and care section and a visiting area with a recliner, love seat and television to create a home-like environment. “My stay has been very comfortable,” comments David F. “It has been nice being able to be by myself and not have to be in a room with someone else.” In addition to private suites, St. Patrick’s offers quality therapy programs and offers emotional and spiritual healing. When a patient comes to St. Patrick’s, we not only care for them, but the entire family. This is a time where loving, family support can accelerate a quick recovery and successful transition back home.

Amid the new facilities that now also call Naperville home, St. Patrick’s continues to stand out as a nonprofit, mission-based facility providing the highest quality of care. We have a loving staff and over 250 volunteers who give their time, dedication and love to our residents... and of course, the Carmelite Sisters, who through their Mission and love are “meeting the needs of the times.”

St. Patrick’s offers sub-acute, short-term rehabilitation services for individuals 55 and over.
