- They were first made by the Egyptians to protect their wheat fields, especially along the Nile River.
- In Medieval Britain, there was an actual job for young boys called a "bird scarer" who wandered the fields with bags of stones to throw at the birds.
- The most famous scarecrow is the fictional character in The Wizard of Oz.
- Around the U.K., scarecrows have many different nicknames depending on where you are, such as Hodmedod, Hay-man, Gallybagger, Tattie Bogal, Bwach, etc.
- Iconic Appearance: A Scarecrow's appearance is instantly recognizable. His straw body, patched clothes, and straw hat have become iconic symbols as fall decor.
